Course Description: The dojo instructor, both new and experienced, would benefit. It is intended for instructors who teach students who are usually beginners or not very experienced. The focus is on fundamentals and skill development within a rather short timeframe of interaction between the instructor and the participants (such as 1 or 2 classes weekly).

Modules & Respective Learning Outcomes:

- **Teaching and Learning-** *After finishing this module, coaches will be able to take a critical look at their own teaching. They will also leave with several assessment tools that will enable them to keep working on their own to improve their effectiveness as a teacher. In particular, coaches will be able to (a) Implement an appropriately structured and organized practice, (b) Make interventions that promote learning,*
- **Make Ethical Decisions** - *After finishing this module, coaches will be able to apply a process for making ethical decisions that is based on the NCCP Code of Ethics. In particular, they will be able to (a) Establish the facts in a situation, (b) Decide whether the situation involves legal or ethical issues, (c) Identify their options and possible consequences, (d) Evaluate their options, (e) Choose the best option, (f) Implement their decision.*
- **Analyzing Performance Part A** - *The learning activities in this module focus on coaches' role in analyzing performance. In particular, coaches will be able to do the following after finishing this module: (a) Analyze technical and tactical performance for factors that influence performance; (b) Analyze technical and tactical performance by observing and defining key performance factors that affect technical and tactical performance; (c) Analyze technical and tactical performance by applying the principles of motion to detect and correct key performance factors; (d) Use technology to assist in analyzing technical and tactical performance; (e) Identify strategies to monitor and evaluate technical and tactical performance; (f) Implement and assess the effectiveness of corrections.*
