



Karate Canada National Championships NCCP policy

In order to assure that Provincial Coaching Staff are obtaining the proper training to provide their athletes with the best possible support and in alignment with Sport Canada Expectations, Karate Canada is establishing the following requirements for coaches who wish to participate in the National Championships and other coaching related events.

- 1) In order to support athletes on the floor of the 2014 National Championships, coaches must have achieved Competition Introduction “Trained” status by having completed the course.
- 2) In order to support athletes on the floor of the 2015 National Championships, coaches must have achieved Competition Introduction “Certified” status by having completed the course evaluation process. Alternatively, they may seek Competition Development “in Training” status as this does not require Competition Introduction Certification but does require other pre-requisite training and completion of the four (4) Karate-specific modules provided by Karate Canada.
- 3) For 2016 National Championships at least 75 % of any provincial coaching staff must have achieved a minimum of Competition Introduction “Trained” status and any designated head coach must have achieved Competition Development “in Training” – which requires completion of the four (4) Karate specific modules.
- 4) For 2017 National Championships all designated head coaches must have achieved Competition Development “Trained” – which requires completion of the four (4) Karate specific modules + six (6) Multi-sport modules.
- 5) For 2018 National Championships all designated head coaches must have achieved Competition Development “Certified” – which requires the coach successfully completes the Evaluation process. The ideal goal is to have at least one (1) male and one (1) female coach Competition Development Certified by this point.
